Now that you've attended the GMC information session, what's next?

STEP 1

Check that you meet the selection criteria:

- You are enrolled in the Bachelor of Commerce;
- You will have completed a minimum of 175 credit points total accumulated at the commencement of the subject including MGMT20001 Organisational Behaviour;
- You have checked that there is capacity within your study plan for a 12.5 point level-3 management subject;
- Your weighted average mark (WAM) is 65% or higher;
- You have NOT previously participated in MGMT30012 Management Consulting.

STEP 2

Apply online by 25 August 2019

Submit the following with your application:

- CV/resume (2 pages maximum in PDF format)
- Personal statement/cover letter
- Photograph

STEP 3

Attend a group interview (invitation only)

If shortlisted, you will be asked to attend a 30-minute group interview on **Monday 2 September 2019**.

Final selection will be based on interview performance, demonstrated and relevant experience, motivation and your attitude to teamwork.

PROGRAM COST

In addition to the standard University of Melbourne subject fee, you will be required to pay a program fee of \$1450. Please note that this is a faculty subsidised amount.

This program fee covers the following:

- Accommodation **16** nights and includes breakfast (minimum 3-star equivalent accommodation based on a twin-share, air-conditioned ensuite room)
- Local sightseeing tour
- Complimentary standard travel insurance policy provided by the University (can cover some personal travel)
