Prior to joining the Commission, she was CEO of the Grattan Institute and Head of its Budgets and Government Program. Ms Wood has previously worked in senior roles at the ACCC and NERA Economic Consulting. She has published extensively on economic reform priorities, budgets, tax reform, women's workforce participation, generational inequality, and reforming political institutions.



About the Faculty of Business and Economics

The University of Melbourne's Faculty of Business and Economics has a long history, with economics education dating back to 1855 when Political Economy was part of the Bachelor of Arts curriculum. The Faculty, then Faculty of Commerce, was established on 27 October 1924 under the guidance of its founding Dean, the 29-year-old Douglas Copland.

Despite initial scepticism from the Victorian Chamber of Commerce, Copland's vision for a broad, interdisciplinary commerce curriculum prevailed and resulted in well-rounded graduates. His belief that a broad education was more valuable than narrow technical training remains influential today. The Bachelor of Commerce, introduced in 1925, was designed to equip business professionals with both theoretical and practical knowledge.

From two full-time and three part-time staff and 323 largely part-time students in 1925, the Faculty has grown significantly, now boasting over 437 academic staff and 12,100 enrolled students. The student body has evolved dramatically, reflecting societal changes and increasing diversity. In 1975, international enrolments were limited to a small group of Colombo Plan Scholars, but today, the Faculty educates international students from over 100 countries, fostering a global network of future leaders.

While progress has been made in increasing diversity, challenges remain in addressing the underrepresentation of women, Indigenous Australians, and students from lower socio-economic backgrounds. The centenary theme, *Arresting Disadvantage through the Power of Scholarships*, highlights the Faculty's commitment to expanding access to transformative education.

Beyond teaching, the Faculty has a strong tradition of impactful research, tackling issues such as poverty, wage gaps, modern slavery and sustainability. Its research critically evaluates business practices and economic policies through a lens of equity and social responsibility.

As the Faculty celebrates its centenary, it remains dedicated to evolving to meet the challenges of the future. Academic rigour and meaningful engagement will continue to shape the next century of impact.

Sidney Myer Centennial Scholarship

The Sidney Myer Centennial Scholarship, funded by the Sidney Myer University Trust, was launched in 2024 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Faculty of Business and Economics. It is one of the most generous scholarships ever offered by the University and the most significant from the Faculty, tying into our Centenary theme, *Arresting disadvantage through the power of scholarships.*

It has already been transformative for its recipients and ensured them full fee remission and a living allowance for the duration of their Bachelor of Commerce degree. The scholarship package, aimed at supporting under-represented groups within the Bachelor of Commerce cohort and students facing financial disadvantage, has so far been awarded to 34 recipients.

The scholarship supports domestic students experiencing financial hardship, high-achieving women and non-binary students, asylum seekers and humanitarian visa holders. Additionally, it assists international students from under-represented backgrounds.

The Myer family has a long, significant relationship with our faculty. In 1927, the Chair of Commerce - held by the founding Dean, Professor Douglas Copland - was named as the Sidney Myer Chair of Commerce following Sidney Myer's gift of 25,000 Myer Emporium Limited shares valued at £50,000 in 1926. The Sidney Myer Chair of Commerce, a position today held by Dean Paul Kofman, reflects this enduring legacy, and the Faculty is deeply grateful to the Myer family for their continued generosity and support.

FBE Advisory Board member and President of the Myer Foundation, Rupert Myer AO, has acknowledged and thanked the Faculty and University for creating the Centennial Scholarships and for honouring Sidney Myer by stating, *'These transformational scholarships are timely, ambitious, generous and a wonderful recognition of my grandfather's initial gifts one century ago.'*

NAB and the faculty: a time-honoured connection

The Faculty of Business and Economics, the University of Melbourne and the Melbourne Foundation for Business and Economics are grateful to have NAB as a principal partner of the 2025 Dinner.

We are honoured to have NAB Group CEO and Managing Director Andrew Irvine join our panel discussion tonight and announce the NAB Foundation's commitment to supporting Indigenous Bachelor of Commerce students.

After World War 1, Melbourne's business leaders petitioned the University to meet the growing demand for commerce professionals. Victoria's state government agreed and authorised an appeal for funds, raising £51,000 (approximately \$141 million today). NAB was among those early donors, putting £1000 (approximately \$2.8 million today) towards the establishment of a Department of Commerce. Since then, NAB and the faculty have maintained and fostered a strong, longstanding relationship.

NAB Foundation has pledged a significant gift to the Narm Scholarship Program, establishing a long term scholarship to support our Indigenous Bachelor of Commerce students.
