Sending a brief email before, and after, your meeting can be a great way to start to build a good professional relationship with your adviser.

How to build a professional relationship with your Adviser?

- 1. Email your adviser to **introduce yourself** before your first meeting. You may like to include what you're looking forward to discussing and any questions you may have.
- 2. **Check the location** your adviser has selected for the meeting and arrive on time. If you are going to be late due to unforeseen circumstances, email your adviser to let them know.
- 3. **Come prepared with a few questions** you would like to ask your adviser. Your adviser is an expert in their field and has a wealth of knowledge and experience.
- 4. After your meeting, email your adviser and let them know you appreciated their time and advice
